Such specification in a citation may be based on, among other grounds, the determination by the citing officer that the offense is aggravated or involves a repeated pattern of misconduct.

MANDATORY APPEARANCE VIOLATIONS

(Revised September 2014)

- Any violation resulting in personal injury.
- Driving while license suspended or revoked, or permitting an owned vehicle to be so operated (N.C.G.S. 20-28 & 20-34).
- Displaying, causing to be displayed, or having in one's possession a fictitious, canceled, revoked, suspended, or altered driver's license, learner's permit, or special identification card; or permitting an owned motor vehicle to be driven by any person who has no legal right to do so (N.C.G.S. 20-30 (1) & 20-34).
- Counterfeit sale or lending of a driver's license, learner's permit, or special identification card (N.C.G.S. 20-30 (2)).
- Unlawful reproduction of a driver's license, learner's permit, or special identification card (N.C.G.S. 20-30 (6)).
- Selling or offering to sell any reproduction of a driver's license, learner's permit, or special identification card (N.C.G.S. 20-30 (7)).
- Permitting an unlicensed minor to drive a motor vehicle (N.C.G.S. 20-32).
- Any violation of vehicle registration laws involving stolen, fictitious, or altered registration card, plate, or certificates of title (N.C.G.S. 20-63(f); 20-64; 20-111(2) & (3)).
- Operating a vehicle resembling a law enforcement officer's vehicle.
- Impaired driving (N.C.G.S. 20-138.1).
- Operating a commercial vehicle after consuming alcohol (N.C.G.S. 20-138.2A).

- Operating a school bus, school activity bus, or child care vehicle after consuming alcohol (N.C.G.S. 20-138.2B).
- Driving by a person less than 21 years old after consuming alcohol (N.C.G.S. 20-138.3).
- Possession of alcoholic beverages while operating a commercial motor vehicle (N.C.G.S. 20-138.2C).
- Reckless driving (N.C.G.S. 20-140).
- Speeding in Excess of 15 mph over the speed limit, where the total speed is in excess of 55mph (N.C.G.S. 20-141 (j1)).
- Speeding in a highway work zone at a greater speed than the set speed limit, where the total speed is in excess of 55 mph (N.C.G.S. 20-141 (j2)).
- Unlawful racing on streets and highways (prearranged speed competition (to include permitting such use of an owned vehicle & betting on prearranged races; spontaneous speed competition) (N.C.G.S. 20-141.3).
- Misdemeanor Death by Vehicle (N.C.G.S. 20-141.4).
- Emergency Vehicle Violations (if injury to emergency response person or property damage in excess of \$500) (N.C.G.S. 20-157 (b), (c), (d), (e), (f)).
- Fleeing the Scene of an Accident (if personal injury occurs or there is property damage in excess of \$1,000) (N.C.G.S. 20-166(c)).
- Passing a stopped school bus that is properly designated and marked (N.C.G.S. 20-217).
- Driving without financial responsibility (N.C.G.S. 20-313).
- Driving on a highway at a speed in excess of 80 miles per hour (N.C.G.S. 20-141(j1)).
- Trespassing (third or subsequent offense) (18 U.S.C. § 1382).
- Any violation charged in the same warrant or summons with a mandatory appearance violation.
