Brian S. Meyers was appointed as a United States Magistrate Judge in October 2020. Prior to his appointment, he worked as an Assistant United States Attorney for the Eastern District of North Carolina ("EDNC"), prosecuting narcotics, public corruption, and national security related cases. From 2018 to 2020, he was the Executive Assistant United States Attorney for the EDNC, serving as Chief of Staff and Counsel to U.S. Attorney Robert J. Higdon, Jr. From 2015 to 2017, he worked at the United States Department of Justice in Washington, D.C. as the National Security / Cybercrime Coordinator at the Executive Office for United States Attorneys. In that capacity, Judge Meyers served as the national liaison within the Justice Department for all U.S. Attorneys and their offices on matters relating to national security, cybercrime, and intellectual property, and supported the Subcommittees on Terrorism/National Security and Cyber/Intellectual Property of the Attorney General's Advisory Committee. Throughout his time with the Justice Department, he taught various courses as a faculty member at the National Advocacy Center in Columbia, South Carolina.

Judge Meyers received a B.A. in Political Science from Davidson College, and Juris Doctor from the University of Richmond School of Law. After graduating from law school, Judge Meyers was an officer and Judge Advocate in the United States Marine Corps. While on active duty from 2004 to 2008, he represented service members and their spouses in various civil matters, prosecuted criminal case, and provided legal advice to commanding officers as acting Staff Judge Advocate at Marine Corps Air Station New River. He was honorably discharged from the USMC Reserve in 2012.
